### BGHS Activities Doctoral scholarships

In 2022, the BGHS was granted **4 scholarships for international doctoral researchers** in the Graduate School Scholarship Programme (GSSP) of the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD).

4 candidates have been selected in 2 rounds in 2023. **Anastasia Serikova** and **Yukun Sun** have already started their doctorates in October 2023. 2 candidates from India will start in April 2024.




### BGHS Activities Workshop


